
Admissions Requirements

- Non-nursing baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited program: GPA 3.00 on 4.0 scale
- If applicant has a GPA less than 3.20, the applicant must take the TEAS (Testing of Essential Academic Skills) Nursing Entrance Exam and earn a 70% or greater on the exam
- American Heart BLS (provider) certified
- Immunizations/screenings, drug screen, and background check for clinical clearance before enrollment
- 500-800-word essay
- Professional resume
- Two References
- Due to the high-level language competency required in nursing, international applicants (those with English as an additional lan-guage) must possess proficiency in English at a level to enable them to succeed in graduate-level studies. View the full require-ments at msn.northpark.edu/admissions.
- Applicants may be invited for an interview

Prerequisite Course Requirements

The following prerequisite coursework must be completed from a regionally accredited institution within the past seven years with a grade of C or better and no more than one W. The minimum cumu-lative GPA for for prerequisite courses is 2.75.
