CHICAGO IS ALL ABOUT ITS NEIGHBORHOODS.

The city is made up of 77 unique and diverse neighborhoods, and each has its own culture and vibe. The neighborhood of North Park is known for green spaces like the North Park Village Nature Center, with woodland and wetlands, and LaBagh Woods, where trails follow the North Branch of the Chicago River. Laid-back global eateries and coffee shops cluster along W. Foster and W. Bryn Mawr avenues near the University campus.

Chicago has excellent public transportation, making it possible to explore cultural events, restaurants, festivals, and all that the Chicago Lakefront has to offer. Students value living close to campus to reduce commuting time to class and will need reliable transportation to get to clinicals.

Housing Cost - You should expect to pay between \$900-\$1,500 for a studio or 1-bedroom apartment, though prices vary by neighborhood

Parking - Be sure to ask the property manager whether there is parking onsite/how much it costs, whether street parking is by permit only, and how difficult street parking is. Permit parking on your street is good but not always necessary. However, all Chicago residents are required to have a Chicago City Vehicle Sticker displayed on their vehicle.
